

# SPANISH PROGRAM

## A1 (3 units)

*True beginner / Access | 1 Unit / 2 Units | 12 hours / 24 hours*

This level represents the starting point. Describes learners who know basic, daily and frequent words and expressions in Spanish. They are able to introduce themselves and others as well as ask for and give personal information about their home, work, family or belongings. They can also understand an interlocutor who speaks slowly and clearly.

## A2 (3 units)

*Platform | 3 Units | 36 hours*

At this level, learners can understand phrases and frequent expressions; they are also able to communicate in common situations, such as shopping and restaurant outings. They can give and ask for information about familiar aspects, describe their environment in simple terms, as well as express immediate needs and past activities or experiences.

## B1 (9 units)

*Pre-intermediate / Intermediate | 4 Units / 5 Units | 48 hours / 60 hours*

Learners at this level become independent. They can clearly explain plans and interact on a trip to a Spanish-speaking region. They are also able to describe experiences, events, desires, and aspirations, as well as justify their opinions. Furthermore, they can understand the main points of common texts and write simple and coherent paragraphs on topics of personal interest.

## B2 (6 units)

*High Intermediate | 6 Units | 72 hours*

At this level, learners are already users familiar with the Spanish language. They can express themselves with sufficient fluency and naturalness when interacting with native speakers. Communication is effective in most contexts. They are able to understand the main ideas of complex texts, both technical and specialized. They can also write clear and detailed texts on different topics, as well as defend a point of view regarding general issues, explaining the advantages or disadvantages of different options.

## C1 (7 units)

*Advanced | 7 Units | 84 hours*

On this level, users understand varieties of extensive texts, with specialized vocabulary, as well as implicit meanings. They know how to express themselves in a fluid and spontaneous way without showing much effort to find the right expression. They use the Spanish language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. They can produce clear, well-structured and detailed texts on topics of a certain complexity, which show appropriate use of the rules of writing.
